

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is Kratom FDA approved?

A: No. The FDA is currently conducting a formal scientific evaluation.

Q: Is Kratom addictive?

A: According to the American Kratom Association, kratom has no more potential for "Substance Abuse Disorder" than caffeine. Chamomile, St John's Wort, and Nutmeg are dietary supplements that are comparable to kratom in terms of the potential for addiction.

Q: Can I quit taking my other medications and just use Kratom?

A: No. As with any supplement, you should consult with your physician before starting use.

Q: Is Kratom an opiate?

A: No. The alkaloids in Kratom bind to receptors in a similar fashion as opiates, and therefore should never be taken with any opiate. Always consult with your physician.





What is Kratom

Mitragyna speciosa (commonly known as kratom) is a tropical evergreen tree in the coffee family (Rubiaceae) native to southeast Asia in the Indochina and Malaysia botanical regions. Mitragyna speciosa is indigenous to Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar and Papua New Guinea, where it has been used in traditional medicine since at least the 19th century.



ALKALOIDS (cont.)

7-hydroxymitragynine comprises roughly 2% of the total alkaloid content and is such a small amount that it is measured in micrograms. This tea leaf supports energy and focus and can also have a calming effect.

ALKALOIDS

Now let's look at the two naturally occurring alkaloids under review. Mitragynine, which accounts for 66.2% of the total alkaloid content from the young leaves of M. speciosa, supports minor relief from aches and pains while acting as a stimulant similar to coffee in low doses.

TYPES OF KRATOM

While there are many types of Kratom, there are three main strains.

- Red Strain
- Green Strain
- White Strain

Each of the three strains have differing applications as a botanical supplement.

Facts on Kratom according to the American Kratom Association

- A 2016 petition supporting kratom attracted more than 142,000 signers from the U.S.
- 1,175 doctors, vets, scientists & law enforcement officers recently told the DEA they don't want a ban on kratom.
- 62 bipartisan members of the U.S. House and Senate asked the DEA not to proceed with a ban on kratom.
- 0% of emergency healthcare professionals/EMTs responding to an online survey supported a ban on kratom.
